How Does the EWTN Media Missionary Department Support Over 16,700 Missionaries? The short answer is ... WE HAVE HELP!

Ever wondered how our small department manages to support all of you Media Missionaries across the entire United States and Canada—including Hawaii, Puerto Rico, Guam, and the Virgin Islands? Then you're in the right place—this newsletter is for you. When Mother Angelica first launched the Catholic Alliance (what we now call the Media Missionary program), she was thinking big—as always. And as the program has grown over the years, it's become even clearer just how forward-thinking she was back in 1990. She built a foundation that still serves us today—a system designed to support you right where you are, in your own community.



How Do We Support You?! The Media Missionary program is here to support you in your role as an EWTN Media Missionary. Maybe your mission is prayer—which is absolutely essential—or maybe you're organizing a small gathering at your parish. You might even feel called to go beyond your parish and share the Good News in your community or across your diocese. Wherever you are and whatever you're doing, we're with you, offering resources and support. And yes—that support extends to all 16,700+ of you!



Across the U.S. and Canada, our Media Missionaries team is working behind the scenes to make sure you have what you need. From providing more than 33 free resources and creating new materials to maintaining our website, staying active on social media, and hosting quarterly webinars—we've got you covered. And through our Regional Managers and Area Coordinators, we're also here to offer guidance and encouragement as you find the best ways to share EWTN.

On a regional level, the United States and Canada are divided into areas so that each Regional Manager can better support you with more personal guidance.

There are eight Regional Managers—seven serving the U.S. and one serving Canada. They're familiar with what's happening in your state, your diocese, and your community and parish. That means they're uniquely equipped to help you where you are with resources tailored to your area.

Thinking about hosting a local gathering?

Or setting up an EWTN information table after Mass or at an event? Your Regional Manager can walk you through it. They can



also support you if you're interested in giving a parish talk or reaching out to places like prisons, hospitals, or nursing facilities in your area.

So, whenever you have an idea or feel inspired to start something new, don't hesitate to reach out to your Regional Manager—they're partners in your mission.

On the diocesan level, you have Area Coordinators, fellow Media Missionaries who have stepped up to help organize and support volunteers within a specific diocese. Not every diocese in the U.S. or Canada has one just yet, but many do. If you're not sure about yours, your Regional Manager can let you know.

Area Coordinators are your most local connection—right there alongside you and your parish. If you've ever wondered whether there are other Media Missionaries in your parish (or nearby) and wanted to connect, they're the perfect people to help make that happen.

Right now, we have 91 Area Coordinators serving across the U.S. and Canada, and they truly are the backbone of this program. They've each gone the extra mile—first saying "yes" to being a Media Missionary and then stepping into an even greater role of service. Each area coordinator is selected by their regional manager. They help keep contact information up to date, share important updates with our department, and stay connected with what's happening locally.

You might even meet one at a diocesan or Catholic event—if you do, be sure to introduce yourself! They know the ins and outs of your diocese and often have helpful insights and resources to support your evangelization efforts. And if you feel called to take that next step yourself, you can always reach out to your Regional Manager to learn more about becoming an Area Coordinator in your diocese.
